

RUSSIAN LANGUAGE AND LITERATURE

Minimum courses required: **9**, to include a minimum of three courses at the 300-level or higher. If the student is interested primarily in area studies, he/she needs to consult the planning worksheet for the Russian Studies major.

Students interested in majoring in Russian Language and Literature should begin Russian language in their very first semester. The department also suggests enrollment in RUSS 298: The Russian Novel in the fall, and RUSS 101: Russian Folklore, in the spring.

Study in Russia through an approved program is highly recommended but not required.
