

## RUSSIAN STUDIES

Minimum courses required: **10** – if the student is interested primarily in language and literature and/or have taken Russian before, he/she needs to consult the planning worksheet for the Russian Language and Literature major.

Students must complete a minimum of three courses at the 300-level or higher as part of the major. These may be taken in any of our three areas: language, literature, or courses in related departments.

All Wheaton students must complete a capstone as part of or in addition to their major. We offer various ways to fulfill that capstone, please consult with the department.

Students should take RUSS 110: Beginning Russian I, in the fall semester, and plan to continue with RUSS 111: Beginning Russian II, in the spring. We also recommend POLS 379, National Security Policy, and RUSS 101, Russian Folklore, both taught in the spring semester. Finally, a student with interest in Russian literature should note our one-time experimental course in the fall, RUSS 298: The Russian Novel.

Study in Russia through an approved program is highly recommended, but not required.
