

Getting Here from There

Wheaton is located 35 miles south of Boston and 15 miles north of Providence, R.I., in the northeastern United States. The college is accessible by car from Interstate 95 and Interstate 495. Trains and buses run regularly between Boston and Providence and the airports in both cities.

Directions by Car

From Boston and the north: Take I-95 south to Exit 6A, I-495 south. Follow I-495 to Exit 11.

From the west: Take the Massachusetts Turnpike (I-90) to Exit 11A onto I-495 south. Follow I-495 to Exit 11.

From Providence and the south: Take I-95 north to Exit 6A. Follow I-495 south to Exit 11.

From Exit 11 on I-495 take Route 140 south 2.5 miles. Turn left at the intersection of Routes 140 and 123. Proceed three-tenths of



a mile east on Route 123 to the visitor's parking lot, which will be on your left.

From the east: Take I-495 north to Exit 10. Follow Route 123 west for 1.5 miles to Wheaton College. The visitors' parking lot will be on your right, just past the intersection with Elm Street.

Public Transportation

Amtrak provides express rail service from Boston and Providence. MBTA commuter rail connects both cities with nearby Mansfield and Attleboro; public buses link the rail stations to campus and other points in the vicinity.
