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## 2000-2001 SUMMARY

The 2000 season loomed as the next step towards greater success for the Wheaton College men's and women's cross country programs. Coming off strong performances by both teams, several expectations were met as second-year head coach Paul Carr saw great strides being taken throughout the fall season.

"Our teams began to peak at the right time," says Carr. "We took some major steps in the right direction as we are continuously learning new concepts and realizing the potential that are on both of these teams."

"As long as everyone is willing to learn everything we teach them, then things will work out for the best," adds Carr. "A very strong sign for us is that more athletes are understanding the system that we're instilling in them on a daily basis."

That approach already began to pay dividends, as the young Lyons improved upon their conference finishes in the New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) Championships. The women raised their level by an outstanding five places, propelling them into second behind power Wellesley College, while the men bettered last year's finish by taking fifth place.

"Our goal was to win the conference championships," states Carr. "We have to continue to work and improve in order to achieve success at a higher level. There is a great nucleus and balance of solid runners from top to bottom on our teams."

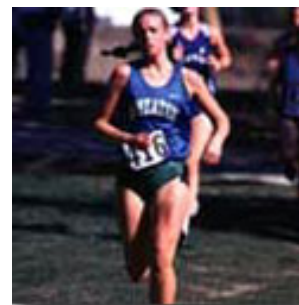
For the men's harriers, NEWMAC Rookie-of-the-Year Stan Pyle (S. Portland, ME) was one of Wheaton's top runners throughout the season, as he helped lead his team to victory in the James Earley Invitational held at Westfield State. Pyle posted a fifth-place standing in the 8,000-meter run with a time of 27:23. His best performance came at the conference championships, running a solid 5:21 pace while finishing thirteenth overall at 26:32.

Five of the Lyons' top six runners for the majority of the season were first-year athletes. Following junior Noah Hill's (Templeton, MA/Narragansett Regional H.S.) first place team finishes (30th overall, 26:00) at the NCAA Division III New England Regional meet, where Wheaton placed 14th out of 35 teams, and prestigious New York University Invitational with second place finishes in three of four other meets, were freshmen Terry Panetta (Hicksville, NY), Paul Machado (New Bedford, MA), Brian Donoghue (Holyoke, MA) and Brannin Buehner (Lubec, ME). An astounding four men ran under 27:00 at the conference meet, with Donoghue just over at 27:33 as he ran a personal best by more than two minutes.

Completing the men's squad was sophomore Chris Scotti (Walpole, MA), senior co-captains Matt Callahan (Weymouth, MA/Weymouth H.S.) and John Drewniak (Hanson, MA/Whitman Hanson Regional H.S.), senior Tim Chamberlin (Portland, OR/The Catlin Gable School) and freshman Peter Cahalane (N. Andover, MA).

On the women's team, Wheaton's 16 members turned some heads at the NEWMAC Championships in late October, as the Lyons proved to be the second strongest squad in the ten-school league. Leading the charge for the women were freshmen standouts Jessica Jordan (Cape Elizabeth, ME) and Katie Knowles (Ludlow, MA). Selected to the all-conference team, Jordan placed ninth overall at the meet with a personal best time of 19:26, while Knowles, who suffered an injury prior to the league competition, finished tops for Wheaton at the Tufts Invitational held in Grafton, Mass. Knowles posted a third place standing overall at 20:44, leading her team to a third place finish.

Seniors Alicia Roth (Sparta, NJ/Hillsborough H.S.) and Kendra Bullock (Berkley, MA/BMC Durfee H.S.) and junior Danielle Huston (Plymouth, MA) were also among the upper tier of runners for the



Lyons, as all placed in the top 30 in league competition. Roth, a co-captain for the blue and white, missed an all-conference selection by one slot as she completed the course as the thirteenth runner. Huston and Bullock earned top 10 finishes at two separate meets. Huston placed tenth at the James Earley Invitational at 20:14, propelling the Lyons to second place in the 16-team pool while Bullock came in tenth in the 5,000-meter run at the Tufts Invitational.

Other top harriers were freshmen Sarah Begin (Winslow, ME) and Abby Weissman (Holden, ME) and senior co-captain Jennifer Hutchinson (Jobstown, NJ/The Lawrenceville School); all of whom completed their conference races amongst the team leaders. All three ran well at Westfield State, with Begin placing 11th overall and Weissman and Hutchinson finishing 22nd and 23rd, respectively.

Also competing for the women was senior Nicole Bullock (Berkley, MA/BMC Durfee H.S.), juniors Gretchen McNerney (Harvard, MA), Annie MacHaffie (Pittsfield, MA) and Celia Leopold (Ludlow, MA), sophomores Kristin Walton (Bar Harbor, ME/Mt. Desert Island H.S.) and Krista Connelly (Weymouth, MA) and freshmen Genet Gebrewahd (S. Portland, ME) and Nancy Nally (S. Portland, ME).

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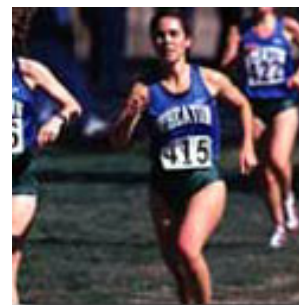
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## WHEATON HOSTS THIRD ANNUAL CROSS COUNTRY RELAYS

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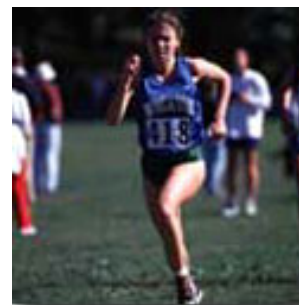
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## 2000 MEN'S AND WOMEN'S CROSS-COUNTRY PREVIEW

August 15, 2000

In his first official off-season, second-year head coach Paul Carr practiced what he preaches to his men's and women's cross-country athletes about setting a higher level of expectation—he recruited some of the best athletes in the New England region.

The result was simply a talented and determined group consisting of seven first-year men and six freshmen women. "There is a lot of raw ability in this class," comments Carr. "The true question of how successful they are going to be will depend on how quickly they can learn and adapt to the college ranks."



"We can't stress how important it is to get our athletes to believe that cross country is the ultimate team sport," adds Carr, who'll be working with assistants Michelle Doody and Tom Ryan. "We need to have seven runners firing on all cylinders at all times if we're going to succeed."

Relating to that success, the Lyons will look to better their conference finishes from last year's New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) Championships. In 1999, the men placed sixth at the meet while the women took seventh.

"Our goal is to win the conference championships," adds Carr. "If we're going to accomplish that, we need to be solid across the board. There won't be any standout runners on our teams, but what we'll need to do is successfully run in a pack as a team."

Although the number of athletes on both the men's and women's teams are lower than Carr would like, there is still a returning core of athletes—coupled with the incoming freshmen—to build on the depth of the programs.

Top returning runner for the men is junior Noah Hill (Templeton, MA/Narragansett Regional H.S.). Hill finished the 8,000-meter run 19th overall in a 15-team meet at Westfield State at a time of 27:20 and 22nd at the conference championship at 26:50.

In addition to Hill are senior co-captains Matt Callahan (Weymouth, MA/Weymouth H.S.) and John Drewniak (Hanson, MA/Whitman Hanson Regional H.S.), senior Tim Chamberlin (Portland, OR/The Catlin Gable School) and sophomore Chris Scotti (Walpole, MA).

Rounding out the men's roster is seven incoming freshmen, all of whom should play a crucial role in the team's improvements. Included in that group are Brannin Buehner (Lubec, ME), Peter Cahalane (N. Andover, MA), Brian Donoghue (Holyoke, MA), Daniel Fokine (Shelter Island Heights, NY), Paul Machado (New Bedford, MA), Terry Panetta (Hicksville, NY) and Stan Pyle (S. Portland, ME).

For the women harriers, their 14-member squad consists of four seniors, two juniors, two sophomores and six freshmen. Seniors Alicia Roth (Sparta, NJ/Hillsborough H.S.) and Kendra Bullock (Berkley, MA/BMC Durfee H.S.) were among the leaders for Wheaton last year, finishing in the top quarter of the pack at the regional championship in the 5,000-meter run at 19:30.00 and 19:37.00, respectively. Bullock also had a top 20 finish at the conference championship, where she paced the Lyon runners at 14th place overall. Roth, who will captain the Wheaton women, was 10th overall at the James Earley Invitational and 18th at the NEWMAC Championship.

Other top returnees for the Wheaton women are senior Nicole Bullock (Berkley, MA/BMC Durfee H.S.), senior captain Jennifer Hutchinson (Jobstown, NJ/The Lawrenceville School), juniors Gretchen McNerney (Harvard, MA), who finished 22nd overall at the conference meet, and Danielle Huston (Plymouth, MA), and sophomores Kristin Walton (Bar Harbor, ME/Mt. Desert Island H.S.), who placed 27th at the Codfish Bowl and Krista Connelly (Weymouth, MA).

Rounding out the women's squad are first-year athletes Sarah Begin (Winslow, ME), Genet Gebrewahd (S. Portland, ME), Jessica Jordan (Cape Elizabeth, ME), Katie Knowles (Ludlow, MA), Nancy Nally (S. Portland, ME) and Abby Weissman (Holden, ME).

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
