Wheaton was among the top 25 in 2009 at both the indoor and outdoor NCAA Championships for the first time since 2004. The indoor slate saw the Lyons capture their Wheaton Invitational before tying for 12th at the national championship. The Lyons took third at the New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) meet during the spring, fifth out of 26 teams at the NCAA Division III New England Championship and fifth among 56 at the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) meet. Wheaton came in 23rd at the NCAA Championship.

Erin Neville '11 and Mickey Jusme '12 earned All-America honors in the high jump and triple jump, respectively, during both NCAA meets. Wheaton's eight outdoor All-Americans were its most since 2003. Chizoba Ezeigwe '09 and Renee Thompson '10 drew a pair of national honors, while Natana Jules '09, Laurenmaria Smith '11, Lauren Cardarelli '12 and Didine Jusme '12 qualified for one apiece. Mickey Jusme was named NEWMAC Field Athlete of the Year as one of three Lyons to record two all-conference finishes, joining Smith and Thompson. Three outdoor school records fell, with Morgan Jamiel '09 and Tope Waheed '12 breaking 10-year-old marks in the heptathlon and hammer, respectively. A 12-year-old 4x800m relay standard was also surpassed.

#### Co-head coach

##### Paul Souza

Entering his 16th year as a Wheaton head men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field coach and second as co-head coach, Paul Souza has led the women's indoor and outdoor teams to a combined eight national titles, four runner-up showings and two third-place finishes during the past 12 years.

Souza was voted United States Track Coaches Association (USTCA) National Indoor Coach of the Year in 2002 and the top coach in the conference and region nine and six times, respectively. A USA Track & Field (USATF) Level I and II certified coach and the national vertical jumps chair for men's development, Souza has produced several U.S. Olympic trials qualifiers at Wheaton.

Highly involved with the USATF, Souza was selected as an assistant for the 2005 World University Games and was one of three assistants for the 2004 U.S. World Indoor Track & Field Championship team. In 2001, he was an assistant coach of the U.S. World Junior team and assisted the 1995 U.S. Olympic Sports Festival East team. Souza has also previously been nominated to coach on the Olympic team. In 1987, he founded the Elite Track & Field Series, one of the premier clinics in the country.

An Olympic trials qualifier and collegiate All-American, Souza earned a bachelor's degree in communications from Pennsylvania State University in 1983 and a master's degree from Eastern Nazarene College in 1985. A native of Mansfield, he still holds the Penn State high jump record.



#### Co-head coach

##### Marc Mangiacotti

Marc Mangiacotti begins his sixth year at Wheaton and second as co-head coach of the men's and women's indoor and outdoor track & field programs. In 2008, Mangiacotti was the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) Division III national and regional women's assistant coach of the year.

A Brockton native, Mangiacotti returned north following five years in Texas, where he spent three seasons as the assistant cross country and track & field coach at the Division I University of Houston and two seasons in the same capacity at Sam Houston High School. While at Houston, he earned a master's degree in sports administration in 2002.

A USATF Level I and II certified coach, Mangiacotti assisted Bridgewater State College in cross country and track & field during the 1998–99 season. A 1998 graduate of Bridgewater State, Mangiacotti earned a dual degree in elementary and physical education. He was a four-year member of the cross country and indoor and outdoor track & field teams.
