Women's Lacrosse

Under first-year head coach Emily Kiablick, who joined the program in January, Wheaton won five of its first seven games in 2009. During non-league play, the Lyons continued a tradition of squaring off with regional powers from the New England Small College Athletic Conference (NESCAC), facing four such foes. Wheaton finished 6–10, including 2–4 during New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) play.

Three seniors topped the team in scoring, with Caitlin Grant '09 and Bridget Thornton '09 each being named to all-conference teams. Grant notched 50 goals and 57 points, finishing her career ninth at Wheaton in career goals (110) and 10th in points (126). Thornton tallied 17 goals and 20 assists, completing her four years fifth in program history in helpers (43). Madeline Williams '09 added 20 goals and 10 assists, while Brittany Whynot '12 scored 19 goals in 12 games, missing four contests due to injury. In her initial season back from injury, Chrissy Norberg '10 recorded 14 goals in her first year as an attack. In net, Marianna Marcellino '11 played every second as the lone goalkeeper on the roster, turning aside 171 shots in 960 minutes of action. With only four players lost to graduation, and 16 underclassmen eligible to return, a youthful squad charges into 2010.

Hired in January 2009, Emily Kiablick is in the midst of her second season at the helm of the women's lacrosse program. Kiablick previously

served as the head women's lacrosse and soccer coach at Roger Williams University from fall 2003 to fall 2008.

In soccer, Kiablick led the Hawks to their first NCAA Tournament appearance in 2008 and pushed the lacrosse team to an Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Tournament championship in just its third year after building the program from its inception in 2004. Kiablick's 2008 lacrosse team went 14–5 while advancing to The Commonwealth Coast Conference (TCCC) Tournament title game and an ECAC semifinal contest. She was twice named TCCC Coach of the Year.

Prior to being named a head coach, Kiablick attended graduate school at her alma mater

and fellow NEWMAC member Springfield College, earning a master's degree in physical education with a concentration in athletic administration in 2003. She assisted the lacrosse program for two seasons, helping lead the Pride to league regular-season and tournament titles in 2002. She also served as an assistant women's soccer coach at Wesleyan University in 2001.

While at Roger Williams, Kiablick founded lacrosse and soccer camps, which she both directed and coached. She was also one of four coaches featured in a Rhode Island Public Broadcasting Service (PBS) series called

"Rhode Island's Amazing Women: Successful College Coaches" and provided material for an instructional book titled *Winning Lacrosse for Girls*.

A 2001 Springfield graduate with a bachelor's degree in psychology, Kiablick was a four-year lacrosse and soccer player with the Pride. A two-year lacrosse captain, she earned all-region honors as a junior and was twice named to an all-conference team. She was also a soccer captain for one year while playing in the New England Women's Intercollegiate Soccer Association (NEWISA) Senior Bowl.
