

CLASSICS - GREEK and LATIN

Minimum courses required: **10** (to include at least **3** courses at the 300-level or higher, one of which is an approved senior capstone).

The primary language must be started by the sophomore year, and the secondary language should begin the following year. Students who enter Wheaton at the intermediate level in one of the languages will find more opportunities to enroll in Classical Civilization courses to complete the major.

Additional language work is suggested for those contemplating graduate school or the teaching of Greek or Latin at the secondary school level.
