General

Minimum courses required: 5, to include a minimum of one 300-level course

The General Education minor is for students who are interested in the field of education and in careers related to education, but who do not intend to student teach or to seek licensure in Massachusetts.

As many as two of the five required courses may be taken outside of the Education Department with permission from the Education coordinator.
