

How to Install Mathematica on your Windows computer

Read this before you begin:

You need administrative privileges on your computer to install Mathematica.

Wheaton has a license to run Mathematica on any computer that is connected to the Wheaton network. If you are off-campus, you can use [VPN instructions](#) to connect.

When you're done:

Only 30 Wheaties can use Mathematica at the same time.

Please **Exit when you finish**, so your friends and professors can get access when they need it.

Install Mathematica

Windows 7: Single right mouse click on *Computer* or *My Computer* and select *Map Network Drive*.

Windows 8: Select *This PC* and click *Map Network Drive*.


Enter the following, as shown in the screen shot below:

Drive: Select the S drive

Folder: \\netspace\shared\software\Mathematica_Win (be sure the slashes are \\ and not //).

Check the box for *Connect using different credentials*.

Click the *Finish* button.



Enter your credentials in the security window.


It's important to add the `WC\` before your Wheaton ID number.

Click *OK*.



You will see a window with the Mathematica *setup* icon.

Drag the three icons to your desktop:
setup.exe & setup1a.bin & setup-1b.bin
This may take a few minutes.



Double-click the *setup* icon on your desktop to install the application.
Take all the defaults: Next, Next, Next, Next, Install, Finish.

After you click the *Finish* button, you can delete the *setup* icon from your desktop.




Activate Mathematica

The Product Activation window should appear. If it doesn't, open it yourself:

- Go the Start menu
- Choose All Programs
- Look in the folder called Wolfram Mathematica.
- Choose Wolfram Mathematica 10.

In the Wolfram Product Activation window, click the "Other ways to activate" button.

Click *Connect to a license server*
Enter the *Server name*: license.wheatonma.edu
Click the *Activate* button



Check the box for *I accept the terms of this agreement*.
Click the *OK* button.

Registration is now complete and Mathematica.app will open, ready to use.

In the future, simply open Mathematica in your *Start / All Programs* menu.

Remember to Exit when you finish, to allow others to use the software!
