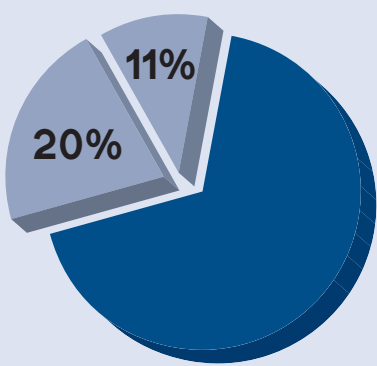

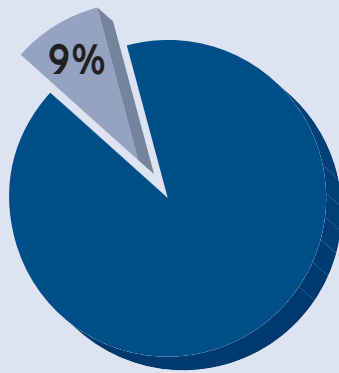

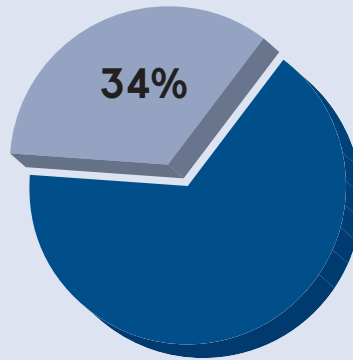

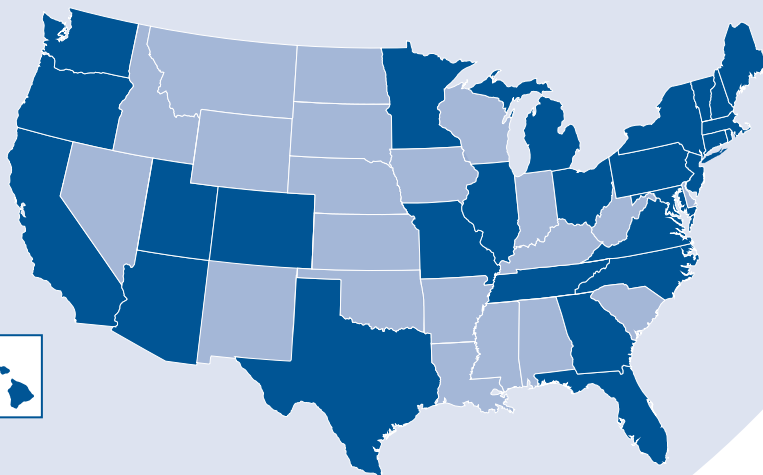

FAST FACTS

LOCATION

Wheaton's campus is located between two great cities—Boston and Providence, each easily reachable via the MBTA commuter rail system.

ACADEMICS

Wheaton College offers 47 majors and 59 minors, plus the option to design an independent major.

STUDENTS

The college currently enrolls 1,650 students, representing 39 states and 72 countries.

FACULTY

The college faculty comprises 132 full-time faculty members, ninety percent of whom hold the highest degree in their field. The current student-faculty ratio is 11:1.

RESIDENTIAL LIFE

All students are guaranteed housing for all four years at Wheaton, and 99 percent choose college housing to take full advantage of our vibrant campus life.

CAMPUS ACTIVITIES

The college offers more than 100 student-run clubs and organizations and the freedom for students to create new organizations to suit their interests.

DINING

The college recently completed a top-to-bottom renovation of all the campus dining facilities and it introduced a new menu that emphasizes fresh, made-to-order meals as well as a wide variety of options.

ATHLETICS

The college fields 21 NCAA Division III athletic teams and offers club and intramural sports programs.
