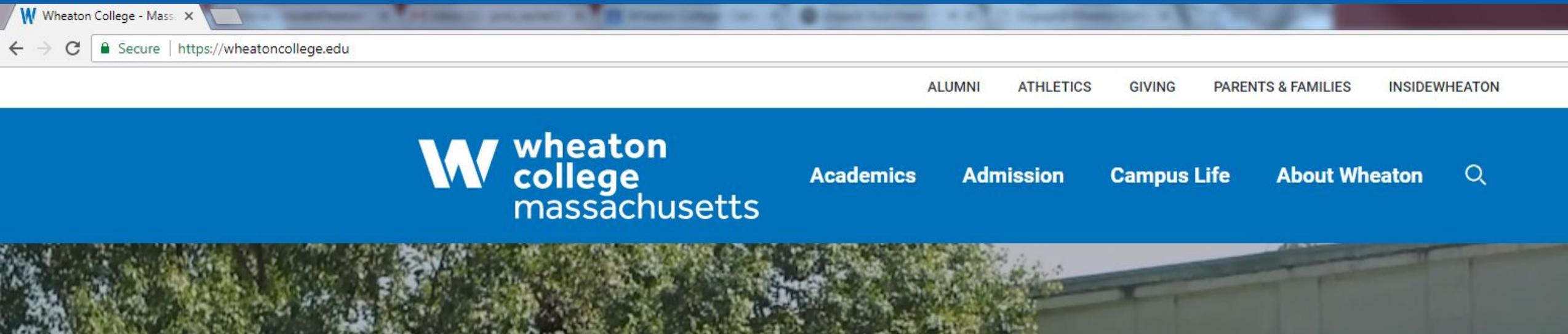

# Room selection is completed in 3 parts.

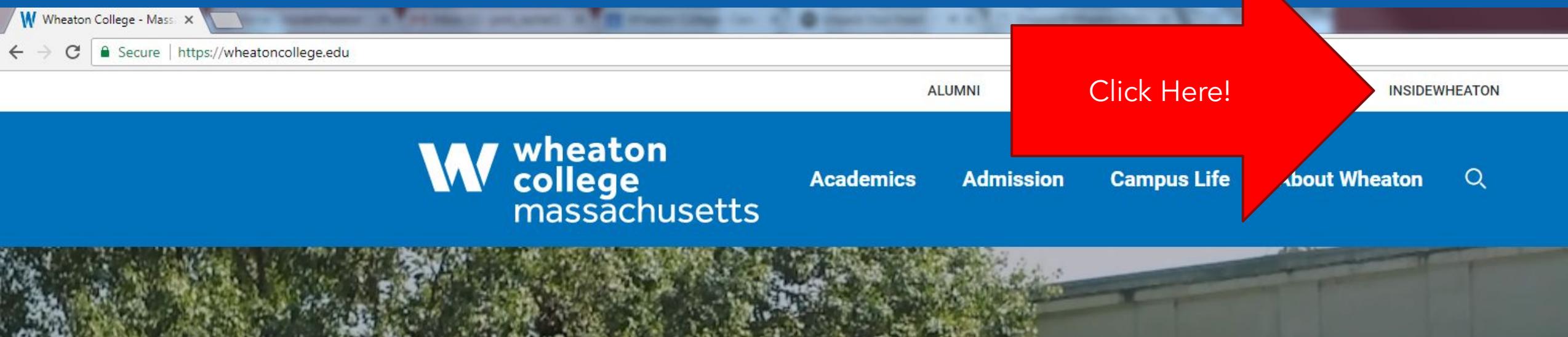
1. Sign the housing contract, confirm your web profile info, and learn more about Community Choices.

Gender identity (not birth gender or legal sex) is visible to other students for roommate profile searches, and is utilized to help ResLife staff assist students in finding potential roommate matches.

## Gender Inclusive Housing

Residence halls at Wheaton are [gender inclusive](#), meaning students have the option to room with people of any gender. This is available across campus with the exception of female to nonbinary and male to nonbinary spectrum housing, as well as female housing, male housing, and specific theme house communities. All residents and their guests, regardless of any gender or gender identity, may use the bathroom facilities in all residence halls and houses.

### GENDER IDENTITY

**Gender identity (not birth gender or legal sex) is visible to other students for roommate profile searches, and is utilized to help Residential Life staff assist students in finding potential roommate matches.** Gender identity information is not currently shared with other offices.

This is an open field so that students can update their gender identity for housing throughout their time at Wheaton, and are able to write the best descriptor of how they identify. Below are also definitions to help you determine and articulate your gender identity. We also encourage all Wheaton community members to read through ["Updating Your Gender Markers"](#) on insideWheaton to learn more about gender-inclusive practices.

**Biological Sex: (noun)** A medical term used to refer to the chromosomal, hormonal, and anatomical characteristics that are used to classify an individual as female, male, or intersex. Often referred to as "sex," "physical sex," "natal sex," "anatomical sex," or specifically as "sex assigned [or designated] at birth." Terms like "AFAB" and "AMAB" (assigned female at birth; assigned male at birth) may also be used in place of "biological female" or "biological male."

**Gender Expression: (noun)** The external display of one's gender, through a combination of dress, demeanor, social behavior, and other factors, generally measured on scales of masculinity and femininity. Also referred to as "gender presentation."

**Gender Identity: (noun)** The internal perception of a person's gender and how they identify themselves. Common identity markers include trans, nonbinary, genderqueer, man/male, woman/female, and more.

**Gender Non-Conforming: (adj)** Someone whose gender presentation does not align in a predicted fashion with gender-based expectations.

**Nonbinary: (adj)** someone whose gender identity blends elements of being a man or a woman, or a gender that is different than either male or female, or someone that does not identify with any gender.

**Transgender (Trans): (adj)** (1) An umbrella term covering a range of identities that cross over socially defined gender norms. (2) A person who identifies with a gender other than what was expected based on the sex they were assigned at birth.

**Sexual Orientation: (noun)** The type of sexual, romantic, emotional/spiritual attraction one feels for others, often labeled based on the gender relationship between the person and the people they are attracted to.

Here you can find information on Common Interest Communities, Living Learning Communities, Theme Houses, and suite-style living.

The first section is where students can opt-into Common Interest Communities (CICs). There are no applications required, and opting in automatically lets the Residential Life staff know that you would like to be considered for these spaces.

## There are many options for community living on campus!

Use the information below to inform your decision on opting in or applying to various communities, and contact the corresponding people for more information.

**We try our best to honor preferences and approved applications. However, final placement depends on availability, demand, and other factors such as accommodations or specific extenuating circumstances.**

### COMMON INTEREST COMMUNITIES

Common Interest Communities (CICs) are residential areas that have unique focuses apart from our traditional halls. There are no additional program requirements. To see a CIC as an option during room selection, students simply must opt in using the checkboxes below.

**Please note:** Some areas such as substance free may require students to sign an additional Community Standards document at the time of room selection.

#### LGBTQ+ & Ally Housing

Housing for interested students who identify as LGBTQ+ or an ally may elect to live in a specific building or floor with other self-identified individuals on the same spectrum.

#### Substance Free

LLC applications typically close the third week of March.

## LIVING LEARNING COMMUNITIES (LLCs)

Living Learning Communities (LLCs) have residential and co-curricular programming. LLCs tend to be linked to a Student Affairs or Academic department and have specific requirements in terms of attending programs and being an active member of the community. Students must apply before general room selection each year to live in an LLC.

### May Fellows / Beard (Membership Only)

[Beard Hall](#) hosts the May Fellows Living Learning Community and expands the educational experience beyond the classroom. This integrated community provides dynamic opportunities for faculty, students, staff, and community members to interact through co-curricular programming. Residents also design and participate in hall activities.

**Beard Hall will be available in General Housing Lottery, but only May Fellows will be able to see Beard Hall as an option to select during their assigned lottery time.**

Roommate groups for double rooms in Beard can have one May Fellow and one non-May Fellow. There may be additional steps to follow during room selection, and ResLife staff will be able to help you through the process.

Finally, there are the suites. Suite applications and roommate groups are live within part 2, and the suite process is only open for returning and transfer students.

## SUITES

### **(Returning and Transfer students only)**

The suites of Gebbie and Keefe offer a different experience for returning students to live with fellow students in a shared environment. Usually comprised of 3 to 6 students, the rooms of each suite have a shared common space and provide double and single rooms for each occupant.

Are you applying for a suite (Gebbie / Keefe)? This option is for returning and transfer students only.

You must read and agree to each section and “e-sign” the document at the bottom using your WID number.

**IMPORTANT:**

Try using a lowercase “w” when entering your WID number. If this does not work, try using an uppercase “W.”

## **Please Note:**

In order to continue, you must agree to each section of the Housing Contract by selecting the check box at the bottom of each section.

I am signing and submitting this Housing Contract to Wheaton College (Wheaton) as I wish to be given a student housing assignment at Wheaton. In consideration of receiving a Wheaton student residential assignment and meal plan, I agree to the following terms and conditions set forth in this Housing Contract, which pertains to the full academic year:

### **A. Usage of Student Housing Assignment and Meal Plan**

- I acknowledge that the time period of my housing assignment shall begin no earlier than one day prior to the first day of instruction for the Fall 2026 semester and shall end no later than the day following my final exam at the end of the Spring 2027 semester.
- I acknowledge that the use of my assigned Wheaton housing is non-transferable. I will use the room assigned to me for my own use consistent with the purposes of my pursuing my education at Wheaton and not for any improper use, and in accordance with the rules and regulations of Wheaton.
- I acknowledge that during the time that I am permitted to use a Wheaton housing assignment, I am required to participate in the student meal plan. My use of the Wheaton meal plan is non-transferable. Wheaton Dining facilities are only open during the hours as posted. No refunds will be made in lieu of meals.
- I acknowledge that all dining facilities will be closed or have limited hours over Thanksgiving, Winter, and Spring breaks as referenced on the campus calendar. I understand that it is my responsibility to find meals on my own during these closure periods.
- I acknowledge that housing facilities will remain open during the Thanksgiving and Spring Break periods. All housing facilities will be closed over the winter break period. I understand that it is my responsibility to find housing during winter break.
- I acknowledge that I am subject to and responsible for adhering to Wheaton rules and regulations, including without limitation, Campus Policies and Community Standards outlined in the [Student Handbook](#), [Residential Policies](#), [the Wheaton Honor Code](#), [Fire Safety Expectations](#), as well as all state and federal laws. I understand that my failure to do so may result in student conduct action or additional resolution managed by Wheaton, as determined in its sole discretion, including but not limited to, administrative relocation and removal from student housing. I also understand that if I am required to leave student housing, I will not be eligible for a refund of any portion of the payment I made for use of

# #7: GradGuard is renter's insurance that is **highly encouraged** for all students.



### What if you had to replace it all tomorrow?



Did you know that Wheaton College, MA does not cover the cost of your personal belongings being stolen or damaged? Due to this, you are expected to obtain renter's insurance before you move-in.

Wheaton has partnered with GradGuard, which offers a unique renter's insurance program that has protected over 500,000 students nationwide. Here are a few scenarios in which renter's insurance can help:

- You leave your laptop in the library unattended as you grab lunch, to later find that it was stolen.
- 🚲 You lock your bike up, head to class and when you return, your bike is gone.
- 🔥 You return to the residence halls after the gym, to find that someone accidentally caused a fire on your floor and the smoke ruined all of your clothes, books and bedding.
- 💧 You accidentally hang your clothes on the sprinkler head. Water damage destroys your stuff and the belongings of other residents on your floor.



# Top Things to Consider for Room Selection (General Lottery)


- There is an additional page in the housing portal before general room selection that shows what rooms are still available. This page is NOT room selection.
- Make sure everyone you want to be roommates with has completed part I of the housing application. You all need to be in the same roommate group.
- You are still able to **connect with and request roommates until the last day of general room selection.**
- Time slots are determined by class year and then are randomized within the class year. For example, all rising 4th years will have better time slots than all 3rd years, and the 4th years will have randomized time slots amongst other 4th years. Class year is determined by credits earned. If you have questions about your class year, please reach out to Academic Advising ([advising@wheatoncollege.edu](mailto:advising@wheatoncollege.edu)) or the Registrar ([registrar@wheatoncollege.edu](mailto:registrar@wheatoncollege.edu)).
  - New time slots become active every 15 minutes from 9am to 3:45pm with 10 people allotted to each slot. For example, 10 people can begin accessing the system starting at 9am. By 9:15am, 20 people can access the system.
  - You can go online and pick a room **any time during and after your time slot.** Time slots are just the FIRST time you can access the portal. The portal remains open for you until the end of room selection week.

# Top Things to Consider for Room Selection (General Lottery)

- If you have a roommate(s), communicate your time slots to each other and we **recommend that you reserve your room as the person with the best lottery time**. If you are confirmed roommates, the reservation will pull everyone into the room.
  - ALL roommates must mutually accept each other and be in the same roommate group in order to be pulled in during room selection.
  - You must indicate that you want to show up in the roommate search as indicated on the "Profile Info" page of the housing application (you can still go in and update this).
- You or your roommates must be able to **fill an entire space** in order to reserve it.
- **Once you pick and confirm a room, you cannot go back!** Once lottery is completed, students may contact our office as early as the Monday after general room selection week. We will help you select from rooms available or keep you on a waitlist for spaces that open in the summer. **BE CAREFUL NOT TO CONFIRM A SELECTION** unless you are sure. This is how we can ensure a fair process for everyone.

# Top Things to Consider for Room Selection (General Lottery)

- Connected singles are considered singles, **NOT doubles**.



- Connected singles are two separate rooms that have a door in-between them. They each have their own entrance from the hallway. The door in-between the rooms can only open if the door is unlocked on both sides. Otherwise, the door behaves like an extension of the wall.

- Time slots are NOT transferable.
- If you are aiming for a single, **have a backup plan** as these do run out. It is hard to know exactly when singles will run out year to year, though generally non-seniors and students without housing accommodations should not expect to have a single room.
- You are able to go back and **update steps within the housing application** to add or detach from roommates, or to update your Community Choice preferences.
